### Happy New Year!

I am not a huge fan of New Year's Resolutions. We make these huge promises to ourselves, like how we're going to go to the gym more, or eat healthier, or spend less and save more. We start out on a good path for a few weeks in January working towards our goals, and we feel really good about ourselves! But then we get distracted, we get off of our plan, and by February we're back to our old habits. US News and World Report noted just a year ago that 80% of New Year's resolutions fail by February. So I'm not a fan of these resolutions that don't bring lasting change, as well intentioned as they are.

But there is a desire for real, lasting change underneath those resolutions, isn't there? Why else would we make resolutions if we didn't actually want to see change in our lives? We are all aware of areas in our lives where we would like to grow.

Thankfully, God is in the change business. Not through New Year's Resolutions that mostly fail, but through the power of his Word. Often we look at the bible as an inspirational book, a place where we can turn to get a message from God to help us through our day. But God's Word is so much more than that. Paul writes this in 2 Timothy 3:16-17: "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work."

What Paul is saying in these verses is that not only is the bible the Word of God, it is also the work of God. God's Word is not merely inspirational, it is also transformational. As we take in God's Word, it actually changes us. It makes us wise for salvation (2 Timothy 3:15), it convicts us of sin (Hebrews 4:12), refreshes our souls, gives us wisdom, brings us joy (Psalm 19:7-8), and so much more.

Therefore if we want to grow in 2020, if we want to see lasting change in our lives, it will not come through New Year's Resolutions that focus on personal effort. Trying harder will not bring about lasting change. However God's Word will bring about the change we desire. The Word of God is also the work of God, and so if we want to see God at work in our lives it will be through his Word penetrating our lives. As one pastor has said: "Where there has been genuine life change and growth there has been a steady diet of the Word." If we want to see change in our lives, we need more of God's Word in our lives.

How can we get a steady diet of God's Word? Consider five regular practices for 2020:

- 1. Hear the Word: Every Sunday the message will be from God's Word. If you miss a Sunday, the messages are available on our church website, missionvillage.church.
- 2. Read the Word: A great tool to read the Word is the Read Scripture app, which takes you through the bible in a year, and has helpful videos to understand the main themes of each book of the bible.

- 3. Study the Word: Join a small group bible study or come to the adult Sunday School before service each Sunday. There is always a huge benefit to studying the bible with other believers!
- 4. Memorize the Word: I know at this point a bunch of folks will say, I can't memorize anything. Not true! You have memorized all kinds of things in your life (songs, favorite lines from movies, the menu at McDonalds, etc....), and you can memorize the bible as well! A great (and fun) tool to help you memorize the bible is the Fighter Verses app.
- 5. Meditate on the Word: I have found this particularly effective when combined with Bible memorization. As you memorize and repeat verses in your head it is natural to reflect and meditate on them. This is where God's Word can sink deep into our hearts and bring about real transformation.

The bible is the Word of the God and the Work of God. I know that many of you are eager to see God work in your life and in our church this year. So let us take in more and more of God's Word in 2020, and watch God do his work in us! Blessings,
