

# Pastor's Perspective

#### Living in Grace

"Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship." -Romans 12:1

For the first part of this summer, we have been exploring the depths of God's grace on Sunday mornings in our series "Grace Magnified." It has been wonderful to see the depths of God's grace in the book of Romans: to see how God's grace is greater than all our sin, to see how God's grace reconciles us to himself, and to see how God's grace gives us hope, even in the most difficult of circumstances. It is no wonder then that there are an abundance of hymns and praise songs written over centuries that sing of God's amazing, glorious grace!

Now we could rightly spend weeks and months soaking in God's amazing grace and worshipping our God of grace. And rest assured we will do that! But at some point, we also need to ask ourselves what this means for our lives. Grace this beautiful, this powerful, should change us, it should change how we live our lives. God in his love for us sent Jesus to die for us when we didn't deserve it. We cannot look at that grace and walk away unchanged.

So how does God's grace change our lives? How do we live in God's grace? What does a grace filled person look like? Those are the questions we will be exploring together for much of the month of August as we continue in our "Grace Magnified" series. We will be in Romans chapters 12-15. In these chapters Paul gives us some beautiful and practical pictures of what it means to live in grace, and to be a person of grace.

August is going to be a fun and busy month in the life of our church family! We have Beach Nights continuing Wednesday evenings down at Mission Bay at 6pm, Vacation Bible School August 17-20 in the evenings (no Beach Night that week!), and our monthly Friday Fellowship BBQ on August 27th right before the kids go back to school. But in addition to these activities, I want to give us a simple assignment: spend some time reading through Romans 12-15 in your bibles, particularly 12:1-15:13. Use these chapters for your daily bible reading time if you do not already have a bible reading plan. Let God's Word sink into you. And if we do that together, we will be even more ready to respond to God's grace and live in God's grace together.

## Youth Ministry

The Youth Group was so blessed to be able to take their annual retreat with our church family at the Pine Valley Bible Conference Center July 2-4<sup>th</sup>. We used our rummage sale proceeds to pay for our 6 Youths who helped us at both our sales: Andrew, Briahna, Christian, Joseph, Jonas, and Matt. We also partially subsidized one of newest Youths: Kristina Haney, daughter of Kim, who came back to our church recently. Andrew and Matt got to travel and stay in lodges with their families. The 2 girls stayed in Terri's cabin connecting to the 3 boys who stayed by themselves in the adjoining cabin. We are very proud of their good behavior they exemplified throughout the weekend, attending all the Youth activities, and abiding by our curfew at 10p to be in their room. Those church members who were skeptical complimented us that everyone followed the rules, had lots of fun and no one got hurt!

We had a very full schedule arriving Friday afternoon till Sunday leaving right after lunchtime. Here are the many activities we did throughout the weekend:

- Frisbee Golf upon arrival
- First meeting session, the youth met outside with Pastor Steve and Terri who shared stories.
- Afterwards we went to the game room where the Youths had a blast, it was thundering loud.
- Sat. breakfast was waffles and sausages
- We met in the Youth Room with our 15 Youths and discussed the Greatest Commandment, then 10 commandments and how the Lord said.
