Pastor's Perspective

"But encourage one another daily, as long as it is called 'Today,' so that none of you may be hardened by sin's deceitfulness." -Hebrews 3:13

A few weeks ago, several folks on our Leadership Council were able to attend an online ministry conference along with me. It was an awesome experience, and I am looking forward to sharing some of the highlights with all of you in the weeks and months to come!

One of the main speakers at the conference was a man by the name of Julius Kim, and he shared openly about his nearly fatal Covid-19 experience. He preached from Hebrews chapter 3 and taught on holding "firmly to our confidence and the hope in which we glory" (Hebrews 3:6). His main point? Just keep swimming. Just keep swimming. It was a much-needed message after a very hard year!

And one of the ways we "just keep swimming" is by encouraging one another (Hebrews 3:13). In fact, God designed to encourage one another as brothers and sisters in Christ. I do not know about you, but all these upcoming opportunities and activities are encouraging me to keep swimming. So, let us encourage one another to just keep swimming!

A good and perfect gift

James 1:17

¹⁷ Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadow.

Matthew 5:44-45

44 But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, 45 that you may be children of your Father in heaven. He causes his sun to rise on the evil and the good and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous.

Based on the above scriptures, we know that our Lord pours out His blessings on both believers and un-believers. Though sun and rain are specifically mentioned blessings, the passage in James makes it clear that all the good things we experience are from our Lord. What we need to understand is that these wonderful blessing from the Lord will have the greatest impact on our lives when we know the author of those blessings. The experience of blessings, coupled with faith, will truly change our hearts. What I desire for us is to consider how those blessings from the Lord impact our lives and how could those blessings impact the lives of an unbeliever. Out of the myriad of blessings the Lord pours upon his creation I want to focus on the one addressed in the Philippians passage below; peace.

Philippians 4:7

7 And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

In the life of a believer, this is how the specific blessing should impact our hearts and mind. The absence of peace, sadly, is sometimes a struggle for our brothers and sisters in Christ. We have witnessed the very real struggle in this past year. My challenge and my prayer for my family in Christ is that we <u>fully</u> accept this "good and perfect gift" (His peace) from our Lord. Why? Because from what I understand from the Scriptures, the reason our Lord pours out this "good and perfect gift" — is to be a beacon to unbelievers. We are living testaments to how this gift of peace will have its perfect effect in times of trial and uncertainty. I believe that our Lord pours out His blessings upon us all as both a perfect expression of His love and as a way to draw His children to Him. In that act of drawing His children to Him we believers have an important role. My prayer continues to be that as we grow in the truth shown in Philippians 4:7 and with all the gifts our Lord bestows upon us, that we will be effective instruments for Jesus, reaching the world around us.

Mission's Ministry

Below are some exciting updates from the Serra Mesa Food Pantry. The pantry:

- Has been serving 115-120 families per week. Just in the past few weeks the number of families has started to decline, which is a positive sign for the community.
- Has established new partnerships and welcomed new volunteers who are eager to serve the community.
- Received a \$5,000 COVID-19 Capacity Equipment Grant from the San Diego Food Bank, which will be used for additional storage space, upgraded weatherproof signs, and more.

As a reminder, the pantry is open to the community for drive-by food pickup 10am - 1pm on Wednesday mornings on the MVCF campus (using safe, social distancing precautions) and welcomes volunteers.
