## Pastor's Perspective

Growing for Christmas

"But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To him be the glory both now and forever!" -2 Peter 3:18

My friends, Christmas is coming. It's hard for me to wrap my head around that sentence: Christmas is coming. It seems like the kids just went back to school at the beginning of September. What happened to the time? But we are moving along into November, and Advent begins the Sunday after Thanksgiving this year. Christmas is coming!

This is always a busy season. But in the midst of the busyness, I hope we can take some time to prepare our hearts for Advent, so when Advent does arrive, we are ready for everything the Lord has for us. And the Apostle Peter offers some wonderful wisdom for how we can prepare. In 2 Peter, the apostle speaks of the coming of the Lord (Jesus' second Advent, not his first!) and encourages his fellow believers to stand firm in their faith. And he finishes his letter with these words: "But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To him be the glory both now and forever!" That is wonderful wisdom, not only to prepare for Jesus' second coming but also to prepare to celebrate his first coming at Christmas.

Three simple truths in this verse for us to prepare our hearts as we approach this Christmas season:

## Grow

Peter exhorts his fellow believers to grow, or quite literally, to keep on growing. We should always be growing. Christian growth is not like puberty where human beings have a massive (and awkward!) growth spurt in our youth, plateau, and then start a long, slow process of decline for the rest of our lives. No, we should always continue to grow in our relationship with the Lord. There should never be a time on this side of heaven where we

say, "I think I'm done growing spiritually. I think I've learned enough, grown enough, and had my character shaped enough." Until we take our final breath in this world, we should actively be growing.

## Grow in Grace

With everything going on in our world, and the divisiveness and animosity we see every day, the world could certainly use a heavy dose of grace right now. As followers of Jesus we are uniquely qualified to offer that grace to the world. We should be known as a people of grace. The best way I know to grow in grace is to preach the gospel to yourself every single day. Author Tim Keller defines the gospel this way in his book *The Meaning of Marriage*: "We are more sinful and flawed in ourselves than we ever dared believe, yet at the very same time, we are more loved and accepted in Jesus Christ than we ever dared hope." If we were to genuinely preach that message to ourselves everyday, we would be daily reminded of how much grace God has lavished into our lives through Jesus Christ. And the more we are reminded of God's grace in our lives, the more we will extend grace to others and to ourselves. That is how we grow in grace.

## Grow in Knowledge

There are 66 books in the Bible, and every single one of them points to Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior. So God's Word gives us a vast reservoir to daily grow in the knowledge of our Lord and Savior. This month as we prepare for Advent, if you are not in the habit of reading your Bible every day, start having a daily time of bible reading and prayer. Not only will your knowledge of Jesus grow, but starting your day in God's Word has a wonderful effect of shaping everything else that happens in your day. The more we take in God's Word, the more we will grow in knowledge.

### One Final Thought...

Our Lord never intended us to grow in isolation. There is no such thing in the Bible as a Lone Ranger Christian. We were designed to grow together with our brothers and sisters in Christ. So as we prepare our hearts for this Advent season, if you are not yet part of a small group bible study or a home fellowship right now, please join one. In addition to the groups that meet on Mondays and Fridays in November, there are several new fellowship opportunities for you to dive into. There will be a monthly home fellowship meeting at the Quion home on Thursdays. There will be an online bible study starting soon for folks who can't yet participate in person or for folks whose schedules keep them from participating in an in-person activity. And finally, Joanna will be starting a women's bible study on Wednesday nights during the same time as our youth group. Details on these groups will be announced soon. So if you are not yet part of a home fellowship, please let me know, and we'll get you connected with one of these groups!

Let's prepare our hearts for this coming season, grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. May Jesus receive all the glory as we celebrate this season.

<u>What does worship mean to you?</u> Pastor Steve asked our Youth Group and enlightened them, as they enlightened us with their answers. In Christianity worship is the act of attributing reverent honor and homage to God. In the New Testament, various words are used to refer to the term worship. One is proskuneo ("to worship") which means to bow down to God or kings.

How do we worship God?

- Singing songs
- Praying
- Having fellowship in the Father's name -being together in His name
- Reading the Bible

And many more ways. Stay on it, whatever works for you – just do it!

## Romans 12:1 (NLT)

"And so, dear brothers and sisters, I plead with you to give your bodies to God because of all he has done for you. Let them be a living and holy sacrifice—the kind he will find acceptable. This is truly the way to worship him." Or

Therefore I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God; this is your spiritual act of worship.

We discussed each line of Romans 12:1 together.

In view of God's mercy, God sent Jesus to save us. Worship is a response to God because he has given everything to us. How do you make sacrifices to God?

- Getting up early to go to church instead of playing video games or watching TV or football
- Making decisions to go to bed early the night before church to be ready to receive God's Word
- Youths expressed 'getting good energy' from actually listening to the message given in church
- Take the time out of your day to set a time to pray to develop a deeper relationship with God.
- Praying to God in uncomfortable situations asking for calmness and wisdom before responding.
- Read the Bible, study the Bible.

Dedicate your life to God - change;

- devote your lifestyle to honor God, learn about him more
- Follow the 10 commandments, the principles God has set for us.
- Be obedient to your parents and teachers: honor your father and mother
- Change your lifestyle to add more sacrifices as Jesus sacrificed Himself and forgave our sins.
- Israel worshiped by having animal sacrifices, to atone for their sins. Jesus sacrificed Himself for us to be able to give our lives to Him, willingly and freely.

If there is a conflict of what your parents or authorities tell you to do, God's laws rule. Talk to your non-Christian friends about Jesus. Influence other people, spread the good Word. Rely on Jesus when we make decisions. We need to focus on making good choices. With the clothes- wear an encouraging T-shirt with a good saying. Do not play violent video games. Say no to drugs, alcohol and sex.

We should follow our conscience. Living life is like an interactive video game. We make many decisions each day that are connected and move us toward a goal. God's ways should always be our ultimate goal.

What about our decisions for the future? Be kind to others, especially your family, as they are in your future. Think about God when deciding to do something. Would God be happy if I did this? Soon we may be going to college; would you join a Christian group with others or go to wild parties instead? Pastor talked about his good college experiences by joining a Christion College Youth Group. We talked about how it is ok to say no. If you need to study for a test and your friend asks you to go somewhere else, you can say, "No, I cannot go." God wants you to stay on the good path of life, be a good person.

We had a very good interactive discussion that seemed to 'sink in' and 'plant seeds' for their future.
