

Youth Ministry

Friendship

God's Word has some challenging views on the concept of friendship.

Our Lord Jesus tells us in John 15:13...13 Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends. Then, James 4 says... 4 You adulterous people, [a] don't you know that friendship with the world means enmity against God? Therefore, anyone who chooses to be a friend of the world becomes an enemy of God.

These two statements provide us with the understanding that friendship is a critical factor in fulfilling God's purpose for our very existence. We are first to have a relationship with our God: "Love the Lord God with all your heart, soul, and mind." And then we are to have a relationship with each other: "Love you neighbor as yourself." The dynamic of the concept of friendship appears to impact every aspect of our life. As shown in the Scriptures above, in its extreme form, friendship puts you in the position of giving up your very life as an act of friendship or putting you in direct opposition to the God of all creation. And Proverbs 18:24 24 *One who has unreliable friends soon comes to ruin, but there is a friend who sticks closer than a brother.*" That Scripture shows us how friendship clearly impacts our relationships with each other, for better or worse. We often use the word or express the concept without understanding friendships' true depth and scope and its amazing purpose in the lives of those around us. Friendship also appears to defy time and distance. The exercise of friendship appears to impact the spiritual, mental, emotional, and even physical aspects of our being.

There is an adage that states that people are in our lives for a reason, a season or a lifetime. Most of the time, we don't know which form it will take at the beginning of those relationships. My challenge and encouragement for us is to be diligent in asking our Lord to give us the wisdom and discernment in each friendship opportunity we encounter, regardless of how short or long that opportunity may be.

And to help us make even the shortest friendships the greatest blessing possible in that individual's life.
