After I graduated from college, I wasn't in the best health. My journey as a college student who had a seizure disorder was a roller coaster, and so after I graduated I was pretty worn out. It was great to not do anything for a little while!

But pretty soon I needed to find a job. Like most people, I needed money to buy food and pay bills. But I needed a job for another reason as well...I needed health insurance. Sooner or later, I had to come off of my parents' insurance. This was during a time where you were denied private health insurance coverage for a pre-existing condition. So, the only way to be guaranteed health insurance was to have a job that provided health insurance benefits.

I started out doing temp work, which unfortunately didn't provide the benefits I needed. But one of those temp jobs eventually became a permanent position which came with a full benefits package. I had health insurance! This was a long time ago, but I still remember the sense of peace and joy I had, knowing that I could see doctors and get medications without having to worry about the bill. What a gift!

One of the joys of following Jesus as Lord and Savior is that we receive a far greater benefits package than what I received from my employer many years ago. (continued on page 2)

And we see so many of those benefits in Romans Chapter 8: No condemnation (8:1), new life in the Spirit (8:10), being adopted by God as his children (8:14-17), destined for a glorious future (8:18-25), and being filled with hope because we have a God who loves us (8:34-39), helps us (8:26-27), works for our good (8:28), and has a perfect plan for our lives (8:29-30). That is quite a benefits package!

Yet many Christians sadly don't experience the joy and peace of these benefits. Instead of living in freedom, joy, and peace, we live in fear, pain, and depression. Mental health is declining across the board as we come out of the pandemic, experience the division in our country, and see the horrors of what is happening in other parts of the world. Now more than ever we need to experience and enjoy the benefits of following Jesus!

So for the rest of the spring and into the summer, as a church we are going to dive deep into Romans Chapter 8 on Sunday mornings and swim in the pool of glorious benefits we receive in Christ. We will explore the benefits listed above and much more as we work through what some have called the greatest chapter in the bible. As we begin this series, please note that this is NOT going to be a "mind over matter" series; it's not going to be a "put on a happy face even if you're having a hard time" kind of thing. True joy and freedom never come from mere positive thinking. Rather, this is a series where we will look at God's overwhelming love for us, ask him to meet us in the midst of any fear or pain we may be experiencing, and let his love and goodness transform us from the inside out. I am looking forward to this journey through Romans Chapter 8 with you, and I hope you are as well.

As we prepare for this series, I want to ask you to do three things: First, ask the Lord how he wants to work in your heart this spring and summer. What are the areas in your life that need to be shaped and formed by the Holy Spirit? In what ways do you need to live in light of the blessings God has lavished on us?

Second, pray about who you can invite to come to church on Sunday with you. This can be someone who doesn't know Jesus, or someone who does know Jesus but isn't part of a church family right now. And as the Lord does his transforming work in you, pray for opportunities to tell them about how the Lord is helping you and working in you.

Finally, let me or one of the elders know how the Lord is moving in your heart this spring and summer. We would love to pray for you and celebrate with you as you experience the full blessing of the Christian life.

I love you and I am thankful for this church family!

## A Word from Mr. French

"And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose." -Romans 8:28

This verse has always been a little challenging for me to completely understand and communicate to others. However, recently a brother and sister in Christ shared a story about a very challenging trial they experienced, and this helped to provide me with some greater understanding of this concept. This particular trial cost them both time and money. However, an interesting side effect of this trial was that it put them in place where they avoided a very dangerous and potentially deadly situation. And it really is a "side effect", as they reflected on this event, they called it a God moment, which is an interesting turn of phrase.

I have been listening to a song by Laura Story called "Blessings" which has been receiving a significant amount of airtime on Christian music stations. Part of the lyrics in this song are:

"Cause, what if your blessings come through raindrops What if Your healing comes through tears What if a thousand sleepless nights Are what it takes to know You're near And what if trials of this life Are Your mercies in disguise"

Is there is an inexplicable connection between trials of this life and our Lord's mercies?

"The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases, His mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness." -Lamentations 3:22-23

"I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." -John 16:33

Lamentations tells us that the Lord provides mercies without any qualification, every day. And Jesus tells His disciples that there is the guarantee of trial or trouble in this life. It appears that both trials and mercies are connected. We often view trials as something to be avoided at all costs. While it is true that trials are not fun and are definitely not something we should be seeking out, there is the certainty of trials and troubles. Seeing them in a more positive light could surely impact our level of joy as we go through these various challenges.



Taking part in this traditional meal was a blessed time of learning, celebration & fellowship.












