Pastor's Perspective

"But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart" -Luke 2:19

When I was growing up, the month of December seemed agonizingly slow. I had an Advent calendar, where I could open up a new door each day of the month, that had a Scripture from the Christmas story inside. But I could only open one door each day. That seemed to take forever. Christmas wasn't coming fast enough!

Now however as an adult, I find that the month of December flies by. Christmas always seems to sneak up on me. Thanksgiving happens, and then Christmas decorations, Christmas parties, Christmas concerts and Christmas shopping seem to consume my entire month. And I find myself on Christmas Eve wondering what happened to the month! From my conversations with others, this sounds like a pretty normal adult experience this time of year.

In the midst of the busyness, and maybe before the busyness gets too chaotic, I **wonder if we can take a page out of Mary's spiritual playbook this Advent Season.** If you think you have a lot on your plate, consider Mary: a very young woman who is told she will give birth to the Messiah, has to deal with the social reality in the ancient world of carrying a child before her marriage to Joseph was consummated, Joseph almosts divorces her (which requires angelic intervention to stop), then she has to go through the normal hardships of pregnancy, travel a long distance close to her due date, and after giving birth to Jesus gets visits from random shepherds and people from a far away land bringing expensive gifts (because every **new mom after giving birth wants strangers coming to visit, right?). Isn't that all** just a little overwhelming?

And yet notice how Mary responds through all of this: she trusts (Luke 1:38) and she worships (Luke 1:46-55). But she also has one other response that is worth noting. She "treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart." These words treasure and ponder point to Mary making sure that she tightly held on to all of these experiences so that she could reflect and meditate on what God was doing in that moment in history.

I love the Christmas carol *Joy to the World*. And in that song there is a well known line: "Let every heart prepare him room." Like Mary, are we making room in our heart for Jesus this Christmas? Are we treasuring and pondering the awe and wonder of this season, that God in his love for us sent his son to identify with us, live the life we should live, and die the death we should die (1 John 4:10)? Are we making room in our hearts during this season to know Jesus, grow closer to Jesus, and savor our relationship with Jesus?

Last Sunday we began the Advent Season with a series on Sunday mornings entitled "Let Every Heart Prepare Him Room." My hope is that this month can be a time where you don't get consumed with the busyness of the season, but can take some time, make room in your heart for Jesus, and grow closer to him. Examine the corners of your heart where there isn't room for Jesus and surrender those to him. Because what Jesus wants from you this Christmas...is you. Our hearts are the best gift we can give to Jesus.

Savoring the Season or Tis the season to be jolly???



That's the party line. But for many, the holiday season can feel more like the season of commitments, obligations, stress and even depression. We work through all the holiday events and end up at New Year's Day wondering where our holiday season went. We appeared to have lost the ability savor the season.

Savoring is the scientific term for deliberately enhancing and prolonging your positive moods, experiences, and emotions.

We all have done this process of savoring before in smaller, definitive moments. We have experienced a special meal, a special performance or a unique visual experience. It is important to note that savoring is an action and mindset and not a mood or emotion itself, but rather a way of approaching positive emotions. And as the definition above indicates, it is a way to enhance our experiences. For many of us there will be a significant number of events to experience this holiday season. The challenging part of savoring becomes more than just working through the logistics of getting through this event. To savor is looking for every opportunity to make the most we can in the experiences within each of these events. An example would be: We have an event which involves working or enhancing would be looking to enjoy the relationship you have with those working in that event with you. It can happen automatically. However, I believe that if you are actively seeking to savor that event or the season, you need to approach that process and mindset before those events occur. I believe that if we intentionally approach all the events of this season with that mindset, we will truly be able to savor our Holiday Season.

Job's story is just as relevant now in our modern day. We live in a very difficult times. Why does God allow good people to suffer? Is God just or unjust? We need to be thankful for what we do have." Some of the questions the Youths asked were: Is Bill Gates going to hell? Do serial killers go to hell? What do angels look like? We answered truthfully and said what IS sure is that Jesus backed up his claim: He rose from the dead. He is the way, the truth and the life. Trust His guidance and listen to Him.
