Pastor's Perspective

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight."

-Proverbs 3:5-6

I love these verses. They have been a blessing and encouragement to me for as long as I can remember in my walk with the Lord. They were some of the first verses I memorized. They contain a wonderful promise of God's faithful direction and guidance as we trust him. Trust in the Lord with all your heart.

Now most of us would probably say in response to these verses, "I trust in the Lord." We sing "trust and obey for there's no other way to be happy in Jesus." In theory we have no problem with the importance and necessity of trusting God with everything in every part of our lives.

But...do we really trust God with everything? The answer sadly is no. Paul writes in Romans 8:7 that the "mind governed by the flesh is hostile to God..." So if we were to explore the deepest corners of our heart, we would find that there are areas of our lives where we struggle to trust God, and where we actually trust ourselves more than we trust God; where we quietly but desperately grasp for control.

Given our desire for control, these verses in Proverbs are not only encouraging but convicting as well: "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding." Trusting the Lord with all our hearts by necessity requires us to not trust in ourselves. To fully experience the blessing of trusting in the Lord, we have to relinquish control. To allow God to guide and direct our paths means we have to fully take our hands off the steering wheel.

Where does my help come from?

2 Corinthians 12:8-10

⁸ Concerning this thing I pleaded with the Lord three times that it might depart from me. ⁹ And He said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness." Therefore most gladly I will rather boast in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me. ¹⁰ Therefore I take pleasure in infirmities, in reproaches, in needs, in persecutions, in distresses, for Christ's sake. For when I am weak, then I am strong.

The title comes from Psalm 121. Understanding these two passages will impact so many aspects of our personal lives and the life of our fellowship. The specific application here concerns the apostle Paul and a significant physical challenge in his life. However, the spirit and dynamic of these passages can be many more areas than just the physical arena. In the last couple of years, in our personally lives we have all had to wrestle with a number of physical, emotional, mental challenges. On many occasions we have felt weak and exhausted. I know God's words to the apostle Paul we not meat just for him. I know God's grace have never wavered. The same thing, I'm sure applies to our fellowship as a whole. God's strength is made perfect in out weakness. My encouragement to you is receive the amazing peace that can be available to you when you truly believe God's promise and can say as did the Apostle Paul at the end of that passage. For when I am weak, then I am strong.

We are often our own worst enemies when it comes to the undermining of confidence. Trust in the Lord; always, pray often. Together, you and God are a majority.

(Chapter 3) Life in the fast lane is coming your way – guaranteed. There on the stage was the car of my dreams – a brand new Camaro, Corvette, Mustang, your favorite?

Whatever a person hungers for, Satan will appear to offer it. What do you hunger for?

The greedier you become, the more vulnerable you are to the con men of our times. Beware of the Wolf in Sheep's clothing. The Youth discussed that there are many con men on social media to be aware of. Great spiritual danger accompanies the pursuit and the achievement of wealth. Be wise to thrive. Every spending

decision should be a spiritual decision. Pray before any big purchase and decision you make. Unless you spend less than you earn, no amount of income will be enough for you. Our aim during this time was to help better equip our youth for the future when came to finances, budgeting and spending wisely. We discussed that the importance of setting a budget and proper goals for our money according to God's principles.

Live within your current means. Try not to overspend yours or your parent's money.

We learned 4 Principals:

- 1. God owns all
- 2. There is always a trade-off between time and effort and money and rewards.
- 3. There is no such thing as an independent financial decision.
- 4. Delayed gratification is the key to financial maturity.


