Pastor's Perspective

Psalm 42:1

"As the deer pants for streams of water, so my soul pants for you, my God."

This Fall at Mission Village Christian Fellowship we are exploring what it means to follow Jesus and getting at the core of what it means to be a Christian. And one of the key dynamics that makes a healthy follower of Jesus is dependency. Jesus modeled this dependency for us in his relationship with God the Father. And we see this radical dependency in the psalms: "As the deer pants for streams of water, so my soul pants for you, my God." There is a clear sense in the Scriptures that without the ongoing intervention and providence of God in our lives, we would be finished. Desperate dependence leads to devotion.

Unfortunately we often don't see this kind of dependency in Christian circles. We certainly sing about this kind of dependency in our worship music. But we don't often see it lived out. Independence, not dependence, is seen as a virtue in our culture. We implicitly value stories of people who stand on their own two feet and take charge of their own destiny. Dependence on the other hand is seen as weakness and something to be avoided at all costs.

But radical dependency on God is essential to the Christian life because it brings us daily to God, keenly aware of our deep need for him in everything. Without this sense of dependency, the Christian life becomes more of a burden than a joy. I should go to church, I should go to a bible study, I should help in a ministry, I should read my bible every day, I should pray more. Then when we don't do these things, we feel bad, and end up putting more pressure on ourselves to do better and try harder. This becomes a vicious cycle of effort, failure, and discouragement. But when we have a clear sense of our daily need for God, then the Christian life isn't a burden, but a life-giving joy. Just as I need water to live, I need the Lord to live.

Then all of the things that were once burdens become life-giving blessings. Each experience of God, whether it is through Sunday worship, fellowship with other believers, serving in ministry, reading the bible, or praying, becomes a life-giving drink of water in the middle of a sun-parched desert.

How do we grow in our dependence on God? A great way to begin is by simply praying, "Lord I need you." When you wake up in the morning, pray "Lord, I need you today." When you get to work, pray "Lord, I need you in all of my work today and in my interactions with co-workers." When you get cut off on the freeway, pray "Lord, I need patience and love from you that I don't have right now." When you get home after work, pray "Lord I'm tired and I need you to help me be a good spouse or good parent." At night before you go to bed, pray "Lord, I need you as I sleep, to get the rest that I need for tomorrow."

The more regularly we pray in this way the more we will realize our need for God every single moment of every single day. And as we grow in dependence on God, and walk with him in that dependency, we will discover and experience joy and peace in him as well.

We started with our book Dr. Dobson. The Youths were too busy to read the chapter so I paraphrased it for them. We talked about LIFE and how it can be like a smooth river flowing at one time then when you least expect it, turbulence hits us and we are scrambling and making quick decision to 'right the ship.' The most important lesson out of that was that they should and always do: Ask God for help; pray and pray again. Some of the sayings we read out loud together are on the chart in our room. 
Upcoming: Harvest Festival October 31st. Still decided to do: front lawn or only parking lot? God Bless u.
