Pastor's perspective

Inside-Out Change

"Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! You clean the outside of the cup and dish, but inside they are full of greed and selfindulgence. Blind Pharisee! First clean the inside of the cup and dish, and then the outside also will be clean." -Matthew 23:26

A few weeks ago I was watching a cooking show where the host was using a smoker to cook various cuts of meat with various preparation styles. Needless to say, that show made me very hungry! But one segment of that particular show stood out to me. In this segment, the host took a huge cut of meat, and soaked it in a brine for several days before putting it in the smoker (I apologize if this is now making you hungry!). However he not only placed the meat in the brine so that the brine could work into the meat from the outside in, he also injected some of the brine into the center of the meat so that the brine could work into the inside out.

What a beautiful picture of the Christian life and how God changes us. We all have parts of our lives that need to be transformed; that need to be shaped by God to be more like Jesus (Romans 8:29, 2 Corinthians 3:18). But how does that change happen? Many of us have tried to bring about that change in our own strength to improve behaviors and attitudes. Like the meat sitting in the brine, those efforts will have some impact in our lives, but that change only goes a little bit beneath the surface, and doesn't get to the core of our being, to the heart level where the change really needs to occur in order to see sustained spiritual growth and transformation.

Clearly this approach to change doesn't lead to lasting change. But we can so easily become focused on our own efforts at making surface changes in our lives that we fail to see our need for deep, inner transformation. This is what Jesus is condemning the Pharisees for in Matthew 23:26 when he tells them to clean the inside of the cup first. The Pharisees thought they were better than everyone else because of their external obedience to the law. They thought they had their act together. They looked like they had their act together. But Jesus points out that their hearts were not right before God.

Before we join Jesus in his condemnation of the Pharisees, we need to realize that we so easily do the exact same thing that the Pharisees did. We portray a version of ourselves on social media that is better than our real selves. We focus on how we look and act at church on Sunday but do not look at what is going on in our hearts. We publicly declare our love for others while inwardly holding a grudge against someone. Like the Pharisees, we far too easily focus on how the outside of the cup looks, and we don't look inside the cup.

Thankfully, God is in the business of cleaning the inside of the cup. He is in the business of changing us from the inside out. As we open ourselves to God and give the Holy Spirit more access to every area of our lives, the change that we really need is initiated by God, carried out by God, and works outward into every area of our lives, just like the brine that was injected deep into the meat in the cooking show. This is the kind of transformation that leads to true, lasting change, that lets us fully love God with ALL our hearts, ALL our soul, ALL our mind, and ALL our strength (Mark 12:30). This is the change we really need in our lives!

If this is something God does, you may wonder then: what is our role in this inside-out process of change? How do we cultivate this inner transformed life? These are the questions that we will be tackling this summer during the Adult Sunday School hour (8:30am), starting on June 11th. We'll be working through a DVD study by Dallas Willard called *Renovation of the Heart that focuses on this inside-out process of spiritual transformation. If you haven't been part of that group for a while, or if you've never been part of it, this is a great time to jump in!*

How does God want to move in your heart this summer? Come join us on Sundays at 8:30am as we explore and experience the Christian life from the inside out. I look forward to seeing you there!

Children's Ministry

Shine Jesus' Light

No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:15-16).

This is an amazing command from Jesus. Let us consider two important aspects of shining Jesus' light. First, shining Jesus' light is not unidirectional but bi-directional. It affects those shining as well as those upon whom the light is shone. Secondly, one size does not fit all. Circumstances and situations as well the individuals involved will indicate how we shine that light.

The first consideration shows us that we are much more than just a reflection of Jesus' light. Light can reflect off a mirror or the water very effectively. However, neither the mirror nor the water are impacted or changed by that reflected light. A lantern, as in the scripture above or a light bulb are both sources of light. However, both the lantern and the light are impacted internally by that light. At the very least heat is experienced by both of those items. Jesus' light, via the presence of the Holy Spirit in us, impacts our lives and those around us. This is God's true law of physics.

The second consideration reveals that shining Jesus' light transcends who we are and what limitations we perceive ourselves to have. And can be demonstrated in an infinite number of ways. Our "Vacation Bible School/ VBS " theme this year is "Shining Jesus' Light." In this program we help the children understand what this looks like in only five of the many situations of life. They are: When life feels dark , Shine Jesus' light; When people don't get along together, Shine Jesus' light; When good things happen, Shine Jesus' light; When people are sad, Shine Jesus' light; When people need help, Shine Jesus' light. Just consider the range of actions in shining Jesus light:

When life feels dark: Quietly sitting together to providing a place to liveWhen people don't get along together: Words of peace to an interventionWhen good things happen: A simple thank you to extreme philanthropyWhen people are sad: A hug a to lifetime relationshipWhen people need help: Holding open a door to providing significant need

I believe that shining Jesus' light is ultimately the fulfillment of God's second commandment to love your neighbor as yourself. Please prayerfully consider the ways in which you can shine Jesus' light in this world.
