Becoming a Little Christ

"Then Jesus came to them and said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." -Matthew 28:18-20

In 2003, Billy Graham led one of his final evangelistic crusades in San Diego, California. As a young adult, I was excited to be part of the event, partially to see the kingdom impact it would have on our city, and partially because I simply wanted to see Billy Graham preach. In the lead up to the four-day event, there was extensive training for churches and church members who would be participating and serving at the event in some way. During that training, a representative from the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association issued a sobering warning amidst the excitement for the upcoming event. He said something comparable to "if churches do not follow up with people who make decisions for Christ, if there is no discipleship after this event, then this whole thing is pointless."

The message was clear. Evangelism is not the end of the Great Commission. Jesus' command to his disciples in Matthew 28:18-20 is to "make disciples of all nations," not simply to make converts. Spiritual formation then, lies at the heart of Jesus' Great Commission; to help those who believe in Jesus to become fully devoted followers of Jesus. And the New Testament makes it clear that this maturing process is not simply a process of self-improvement, it is a process of radical, Holy Spirit driven transformation to become like Jesus (2 Corinthians 3:18; Romans 8:29, 12:2; Philippians 3:20-21), where Christ is actually formed in the life of a believer. As C.S. Lewis succinctly states in his classic work *Mere Christianity*, "Every Christian is to become a little Christ. The whole purpose of becoming a Christian is simply nothing else."

If every Christian is to become a little Christ, if every Christian is to become more and more like Jesus as they follow Jesus, then we need to honestly wrestle with several questions. First, am I becoming a little Christ? Is my personal life structured in such a way where I am allowing the Holy Spirit to make me like Jesus? Over time, do I see less and less of my sin and more and more of Jesus' heart in me?

Second, am I helping my brothers and sisters in Christ become little Christs? Are my relationships at Mission Village Christian Fellowship simply friendly, or are they also transformational? If we think of the transforming work of the Holy Spirit like a wave that washes over us, are we helping our fellow brothers and sisters get in front of that wave?

Finally, is our church family of Mission Village Christian Fellowship structured in such a way that helps us to become little Christs? Are our Sunday worship services, biblical teaching, fellowship times, small groups, and other church ministries leading us to become more like Jesus? And do we look at the various ministries of the church as simply ministries, or as opportunities to become more like Jesus?

These are important questions. And to help us wrestle with these questions, this month we are going through a sermon series on Sunday mornings (we actually started last Sunday!) called "Growing Together." We'll be diving into these questions and letting God's Word shape our answers to these questions. My prayer is that this series would help us to open ourselves more and more to the transforming work of the Holy Spirit so that we increasingly become more and more like Jesus. The more we become like Jesus, the more our community around us will see Jesus. And our community, city, and world desperately need to see Jesus!

A Reason, A Season, or a Lifetime Author Unknown

People come into your life for a reason, a season or a lifetime. When you figure out which one it is, you will know what to do for each person.

When someone is in your life for a REASON, it is usually to meet a need you have expressed. They have come to assist you through a difficulty; to provide you with guidance and support; to aid you physically, emotionally or spiritually. They may seem like a godsend, and they are. They are there for the reason you need them to be.

Then, without any wrongdoing on your part or at an inconvenient time, this person will say or do something to bring the relationship to an end. Sometimes they die. Sometimes they walk away. Sometimes they act up and force you to take a stand. What we must realize is that our need has been met, our desire fulfilled; their work is done. The prayer you sent up has been answered and now it is time to move on.

Some people come into your life for a SEASON, because your turn has come to share, grow or learn. They bring you an experience of peace or make you laugh. They may teach you something you have never done. They usually give you an unbelievable amount of joy. Believe it. It is real. But only for a season.

LIFETIME relationships teach you lifetime lessons; things you must build upon in order to have a solid emotional foundation. Your job is to accept the lesson, love the person, and put what you have learned to use in all other relationships and areas of your life. Love is blind but friendship is clairvoyant.

Who??

Nearly three-quarters of a century of life experience have shown me that the above ideas are true and good. Those, coupled with James 1:17 NIV: "Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows" causes me to ask the question, who's reason, who's season and who's lifetime? We serve a God who has a perfect purpose and plan in all His creation. Even when we think we know the answer, we should ask God, "is that all?" The answer may not come immediately. Trust and patience may be an important part of the process, especially when we don't have any understanding of the reason, season or even lifetime.

Our God has given a wonderful and unique creation to explore and regard His handiwork. However with all that amazing intricacy, the most unique part of creation is the exploration of our relationships. First with God the Father, and then with each other. Remember His commandment, "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" He said to him, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. 'This is the greatest and first commandment. And the second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself. Matt 22:36-40. Have a wonderful and prayerful exploration.

This special "MOMENTUM Advances" event will benefit the Human Factor Leadership Academy (HFLA) in Ghana. The evening will include entertaining music, a delicious Ghanaian dinner, an array of Ghanaian items for sale, informative speakers, and a fun memorable experience for all.

Founder and President Senyo Adjibolosoo, Ph.D., created IIHFD (International Institute for Human Factor Development) with the belief that improving the human condition is not dependent on external factors like laws, money, or technology, but rather on internal factors like Love, Grace, Compassion and Forgiveness — the primary positive Human Factor qualities. The vision of IIHFD is to improve the quality of the Human Factor with a mission of producing honest and compassionate leaders.

IIHFD was initially established in 1992 in Canada. In 1999, IIHFD was incorporated in the United States as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization. The Human Factor Leadership Academy (HFLA) was established in Akatsi in the Volta Region of Ghana in 2010 and continues to provide worldwide impact of the IIHFD.

The HFLA in Ghana is thriving and successful and has been achieving the Human Factor quality goals for over 12 years. The school currently serves approximately 400 students ranging from Pre-Kindergarten to 12th grade. The goal is to reach out globally with HFLA's ongoing excellent academic program and training.

There is a basic school and a senior high campus at HFLA in Akatsi. In May 2022, a severe tropical rain in Ghana caused major flooding and damage to the basic school campus. Many books, laptops, and other supplies were lost. There is much to replace and rebuild. The MOMENTUM fundraiser will help with these immediate needs as well as ongoing essential necessities.
