Do You Have An Answer?

"But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have." -1 Peter 3:15

A few weeks ago Joanna was participating in an online training as part of a networking group she belongs to. She was asked to serve a six month leadership term (something everyone eventually does in that group), and this training was for that leadership position. For those not familiar with a networking group, the concept is simple: Business professionals from various occupations meet regularly together, build relationships with one another, talk about their various businesses, and refer business to one another. So participating in a networking group helps your business to grow and helps other businesses to grow.

Unfortunately, this online training was long. Several hours long. Joanna eventually had to lie down on the couch and put the training seminar on speaker so she could finish it. Which meant that I got to hear the last part of the training, which interestingly was on how to get new people to join your networking group. How do you get someone who is not part of your networking group to come, check out the group, and join the group?

This of course is not just a question on the minds of business professionals and networking groups, it is a question on the minds of many Christians. Church attendance has been in decline for a long time in this country, and especially so since the Covid-19 pandemic.

Pastor's perspective continued

Our culture is becoming increasingly post-Christian and increasingly hostile to the exclusive claims of Jesus as the only way to God. In the past you could invite someone to church, and they were likely to come because they had a worldview that valued church attendance as a good and positive thing for their lives. Now it is hard for most non-Christians to see any value in going to church, especially when it entails giving up precious hours of your free time on a weekend after a long and hard work week (especially during football season!).

Given these dynamics, it is not surprising that on multiple occasions I have had conversations with various folks at our church asking that same question: how do we get more people to be part of our wonderful church family? So when I heard this question asked in Joanna's online training, even though it was a completely secular organization, I was curious to hear the answer. What would someone in a secular organization say is the way to attract and retain new members into this group?

There were several parts to the answer, all of which would take way too much time and space to analyze. But one part of the answer dripped with biblical truth for a post-Christian world: In this seminar, members of each networking group were encouraged to share one specific thing with their friends they wanted to invite: how much the group has helped them. In other words, share why you are a part of that group. Share how many business referrals you get each month from the group. Share how much the group has helped your business. Share how the group has been a key part of your business growth and success. If people see how much the group has helped you, it will be more attractive to them.

It is not hard to see the biblical foundation of this teaching. Peter offers almost the exact same encouragement to brothers and sisters who were experiencing persecution from a culture that is far less Christian and far more hostile than ours in 1 Peter 3:15: "Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give a reason for the hope that you have." Don't just be able to tell someone why you believe what you believe, but also be able to tell them why that belief has helped you. Be able to share how Jesus has helped you. Be able to share how Jesus has changed your life. Don't just tell someone about Jesus; tell them how you have experienced Jesus.

We have many opportunities to invite people to our church in the coming weeks and months. The Harvest Festival is coming at the end of this month. And Advent begins only a month after that. So as we prepare for this wonderful season of celebration and invitation, let me offer two challenges for us in light of Peter's exhortation to always be ready to give a reason for the hope that we have:

First, prayerfully consider how Jesus has changed your life. Why do you have hope? Think in very specific terms on the changes and blessings you have seen in your life as you have grown closer to Jesus and come deeper into the life of this church family. You cannot share how Jesus has helped you if you haven't thought about it yourself.

Second, don't just invite someone to come to church. That in and of itself is not going to draw anyone. Instead, invite someone to come and experience what you yourself have experienced here at Mission Village Christian Fellowship. Invite them to experience the kind of change and transformation and growth that you yourself have experienced.

People do not need more meetings and events in their lives. But people do need help in their lives. People do need change in their lives. People need to be saved. So this fall, don't offer your friends and family another calendar filling event, offer them the God who helps and changes and saves, and tell them how God has helped and changed and saved you.

We call him Father because we are His children, we love each other, unconditionally. Pray anytime, pray more often, short prayers, be confident; trust-give it to God!

Pray even before you talk to someone! Keep praying if you don't get what you ask for right away –

Steve offered our Youths any counseling, anytime, as he said that is engrained in his Master's Degree.

We are grateful to all of you for your unfailing support!


