Pastor's pen

Overwhelming, Undeserved, Unconditional Love

"You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous person, though for a good person someone might possibly dare to die. But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." -Romans 5:6-8

When Joanna first moved to San Diego, she lived with two girls in an apartment in Pacific Beach. Both of these girls had boyfriends, although I'm not sure how serious either relationship was. But I was shocked when I came to visit Joanna on Valentine's Day. The small apartment was covered wall to wall with flowers and chocolates and gifts. These two boyfriends, who clearly were not in a place of financial stability, spent all they had and then some on these two girls for Valentine's Day. And there was a clear sense that the health of each relationship was dependent on the amount and size of the flowers and chocolate.

Now please don't misunderstand me...I think flowers and chocolates are a wonderful way to bless your spouse or significant other (and not just on Valentine's Day!). But what stuck with me on that Valentine's Day was the conditionality of the gifts. It was as if these two guys couldn't do enough to secure their girlfriend's love.

Now we can write this story off as an example of immature young adults who haven't yet learned how to be in a healthy relationship of unconditional love. Yet sadly, many mature adults, and many Christians, fail to experience unconditional love in their lives. Worse, many Christians fail to experience the unconditional love of God. We sin, and instead of running to God for forgiveness we hide in shame like Adam and Eve. We believe that Jesus died for our sins yet anxiously wonder at the same time if we have done enough to measure up to God's will for our lives.

Here's the reality: We have all sinned, and we have all fallen short of God's standard (Romans 3:23). We don't measure up. We don't deserve anything from God. But here is an even greater reality: God loves us. In the book of Romans Paul goes out of his way to emphasize that God didn't send his son to die for us when we were good enough, he sent his son to die while we were still sinners (Romans 5:8). God loves you. That is an overwhelming, undeserved, unconditional love.

This year Valentine's Day also happens to be Ash Wednesday, which is the first day of Lent. What a beautiful overlap of these two days on the calendar! The day the world celebrates love is the day we solemnly reflect on our sin and prepare our hearts for the upcoming Good Friday and Easter Celebration at the end of Lent. Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday together therefore give us a special opportunity to reflect on how much God loves us.

Stuart Townend is one of several musicians and songwriters who have led the modern hymn writing movement over the past 30 years. In the mid 90s he wrote a beautiful hymn: "How Deep The Father's Love For Us." You can listen to the song on YouTube. But I have included the lyrics here. If you are struggling to experience the lavish, undeserved, unconditional love of God, let these words sink deep into your heart this month.

How deep the Father's love for us How vast beyond all measure That He should give His only Son To make a wretch His treasure How great the pain of searing loss The Father turns His face away As wounds which mar the Chosen One Bring many sons to glory

Behold the man upon a cross
My sin upon His shoulders
Ashamed, I hear my mocking voice
Call out among the scoffers
It was my sin that held Him there
Until it was accomplished
His dying breath has brought me life
I know that it is finished

I will not boast in anything
No gifts, no power, no wisdom
But I will boast in Jesus Christ
His death and resurrection
Why should I gain from His reward?
I cannot give an answer
But this I know with all my heart
His wounds have paid my ransom

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ: You are deeply loved by God. Not because you are good enough (you aren't), but because God is love. And while the flowers and chocolates are great, the gift of God's unconditional love is infinitely greater.

Hi Church,

I wanted to share some highlights from the Serra Mesa Food Pantry, which continues to operate on the Mission Village Christian Fellowship campus:

The pantry is open every Wednesday from 10am to 1pm and provides bags of food for approximately 140 families each week.

Since implementing the Oasis Insight program required by the San Diego Food Bank in July, the pantry has reduced its service area to 92123 only, making for a more manageable workload.

The pantry has been grateful for volunteers from its new partner, *Independiente*, *Juntos* (*iJuntos*), a program that helps adults with mild developmental disabilities learn skills that can help them gain employment.

Let's continue to pray for and partner with the food pantry as they faithfully serve the community!

Service Ministry

Service by definition is: the occupation or function of serving, employment as a servant, the work performed by one that serves, contribution to the welfare of others, and a meeting for worship-often used in plural. We often think that this action is something we pay others for or that it is the job of someone else but not us. Jesus taught us otherwise. It is the job of all of us to perform service to each other by performing acts of kindness in thought, word, and deed. One of the greatest truths of our society is that harm comes to us when we isolate ourselves and sometimes find ourselves alone and forgotten. One of the statistics I have read recently stated that many men have no friends to whom they can relate. Women do a much better job of that but still in our society men die earlier than women creating an environment of solitude for the widow.

The solution is to outwardly attempt to speak to someone you suspect of needing a friendly voice and reach out to those who need the concern and consideration of your company. You might even find an opportunity to tell them about Jesus or invite them to our church. In the process we are fulfilling the great commandment and even opening ourselves to His service and will for our lives.
