#### Pastor's Pen

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." -Acts 1:8

Jesus' final words to his disciples before he ascended into heaven were words of commission: "You will be my witnesses..." Followers of Jesus are to be witnesses to Jesus. Through the guidance and the power of the Holy Spirit, the job of a Christian is to share the good news of Jesus with those who do not know Jesus. Evangelism then, proclaiming the good news of salvation, is central to the Christian faith.

But then the question that must be asked is this: how can we be effective witnesses for Jesus? Yes, the Holy Spirit will empower us, and we cannot downplay the significance of that in any way. But knowing the Holy Spirit will empower us for this witnessing task doesn't give us any practical tools for how we can be an effective witness. Evangelism can often seem daunting and overwhelming, and is getting more difficult in an increasingly post-Christian world. Many brothers and sisters either feel discouraged about evangelism or guilty about their lack of effectiveness or effort in evangelism. So let me offer three practical tools to help us grow as witnesses for Jesus.

First, an effective witness for Jesus is a growing disciple of Jesus. If we want to be effective in telling others about Jesus, we need to be growing in our personal relationship with him. You'll have a hard time convincing someone of the love and grace and beauty of Jesus if that love and grace and beauty is not seen in your life. It will be hard to convince someone that meeting Jesus is the best thing that ever happened to you if Jesus doesn't seem to make a difference in your life.

Dallas Willard puts it this way: "The ultimate lifter of doubt—is the believer acting in faith in an interactive relationship with God." So if you find that you are not growing in your discipleship to Jesus, or you feel stagnant and you're not even sure where or how to start growing, I would love to help you get started...or restarted...on your discipleship journey.

Second, an effective witness for Jesus uses the gifts God has given them. The Apostle Paul in 1 Corinthians 12 describes the church as a body, with each part, each believer, serving as a different part of the body. Obviously the hand does something different from the foot, which does something different than the eye. But when it comes to evangelism, much of the frustration experienced by Christians comes in feeling pressure to share the faith a certain way and with a certain outcome. However, a cookie-cutter approach to evangelism doesn't make sense if we are all different parts of the body with different gifts.

Now, just to be clear, I am NOT saying the Gospel message doesn't have to be shared or can be avoided if it's too offensive. The message of salvation is critical for people to be saved (Romans 10:14)! But while the message doesn't change, how we share that message might change depending on our gifts. For example, some are really gifted in having apologetic discussions with people who don't know Jesus, and can talk about difficult topics in a loving and gracious way. Others are really gifted in hospitality, and in creating environments where people can both experience the love of Jesus and hear about the love of Jesus. But the person gifted in hospitality might not be gifted in apologetics and the person gifted in apologetics might not be gifted in hospitality. That's ok. What's not ok is when we go outside of our skill set and try to share our faith the same way that someone else does. That usually gets us into trouble. So when you use the unique gifts that God has given to you, you will be much more effective as a witness for Jesus.

Finally, an effective witness for Jesus meets people where they are, and helps them go where they need to go. If you look at the ministry of Jesus, you will see that he rarely interacts with people the same way, rather he meets them where they are, and he engages their specific life circumstances. Sometimes they believe, and sometimes they don't. But too often the focus in evangelism today is trying to get people across a "finish line." Get them to believe, get them to pray a prayer. Now that can work if someone is only one step away from believing in Jesus. But if someone is further away, or struggling with some significant roadblock to faith in Jesus, pushing them to pray a prayer of faith will not be the most effective way to be a witness for Jesus. Rather, we can meet them where they are, meet them in their struggles, and help them take a step towards Jesus. They might not become a Christian in that moment, and we may never see them become a Christian. But we can help them move one step closer to Jesus.

One way to do this is to take the time to genuinely get to know someone. Get to know them not just as someone who needs Jesus, but as a human being. Get to know their life, their passions, their heart, their fears, their struggles. Get to know their worldview and what they believe about God. Then you will be in a position to know where someone really is in relation to Jesus, and then you can really help them walk towards Jesus.

Grow as a disciple of Jesus, use your gifts (and not the gifts of the person next to you), and meet people where they are. This may not seem earth-shattering or revolutionary. It's not. But these simple tools will help you to be an effective witness for Jesus, and that's what Jesus has called us to be.
