"It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery." -Galatians 5:1

Most of you will read this newsletter on or around the 4th of July holiday. And I hope you have a wonderful time celebrating our nation's independence and giving thanks for the freedoms we all enjoy in this country. But I also want to encourage you to not give in to that which threatens our freedom every single day.

Now this is an election year, and it is easy to find political pundits talking about the threat to our freedom. Republicans say it is the Democrats who threaten our freedom, and the Democrats point the finger right back and say it is the Republicans. They yell back and forth at each other and will do so up until (and well past) the election in November.

But I would like to suggest that the biggest threat to freedom is not the politicians and political pundits. The biggest threat to freedom...is you. The biggest threat to freedom...is me.

Consider what Paul writes to the churches in Galatia. These were churches that started when the people in Galatia joyfully received the good news of the gospel that Jesus died for their sins. They joyfully believed in the good news that in Christ, there was nothing they could do to make God love them more, and nothing they had done to make God love them less. They experienced true freedom, knowing that there was no way they could earn their salvation, and that Jesus had already earned it on their behalf through the cross. All was well and good in Galatia.

And then some folks came along and "threw (the Christians) into confusion" (Galatians 1:7). Their message was this: Yes, the whole Jesus dying for your sins thing is great, but now if you REALLY want to be saved, you have to be circumcised and do all of these other things related to the Old Testament law. In other words, they added to the gospel. They said to be saved, you had to believe in Jesus AND do certain things. And with that message, the churches in Galatia had their freedom in Christ stolen from them and fell back into the slavery of having to obey the law in order to please God.

Sadly, many Christians live in this same slavery today. Many will say, I believe Jesus died for my sins, but then live as if they have to earn God's love and forgiveness. Many Christians feel that because of their track record of sins, that God is somehow displeased with them. Many Christians feel pressure to do more and sin less in order to please God. Many Christians therefore live in slavery. Does this describe you?

Now you might push back at this point and say, well, don't we have to obey Jesus? Doesn't Jesus give us some clear moral imperatives for how we are supposed to live? And the answer is a resounding yes! But there is a HUGE difference between obeying Jesus in order to earn God's love and acceptance, and obeying Jesus because you know God ALREADY loves and accepts you. It is the difference between two people in the early stages of a romantic relationship, and two people in a strong, healthy, committed marriage. In the former, you are unsure if any action or lack of action will end the relationship. And the latter, you know the relationship is secure, so you do things for your spouse because of that love and security. One is slavery. The other is freedom.

Because of Jesus, when God looks at you, he doesn't see your sin. He doesn't see your track record. If you believe in Jesus, God looks at you and sees Jesus and his sinlessness (2 Corinthians 5:21). That is true freedom, where we can then go and fully live for Jesus without having the burden of anxiety, not knowing if we have done enough to please God or earn his favor.

So on this 4th of July holiday, let the political pundits yell at each other over who is a bigger threat to freedom. But you, my dear brothers and sisters, take some time to examine your heart. Are you living in slavery or freedom? Do you live in anxiety that you haven't done enough for God, or do you desire to serve God because of this gracious love that has been poured out onto you through Jesus? Do you beat yourself up when you struggle to read your bible and pray, or when you struggle do you turn to the God who loves you and ask him to help you draw closer to him? If you find yourself feeling like you need to do more to please God, take some time to pray this gospel prayer to God this month: "In Christ, there is nothing I can do that would make you love me more, and nothing I have done that makes you love me less." When that prayer sinks into your heart and begins to change your heart, that is where you find true freedom.
