Pastor's Pen

"Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort that we ourselves receive from God." -2 Corinthians 1:3-4

This is a difficult season for our church family.

That previous sentence deserves to stand on its own. It is tempting to want to add something positive, to say "this is a difficult season for our church family, but here are all the awesome things God is doing." Or "this is a difficult season for our church family, but here is the silver lining." Or "this is a difficult season for our church family but I know that things will get better for us."

Now it may be true that God is doing awesome things (he is) and that there is a silver lining in suffering (there usually is somewhere) or that things will get better in the future (they will). But to try to add a positive spin to a difficult season takes away from the true difficulty of what our church family is going through. Our beloved Christopher is in hospice care. We have others in our church family going through serious health struggles. And that is not to mention the emotional struggles experienced by others in our church family simply dealing with day to day life. This is a difficult season for our church family.

In addition to taking away from the difficulty of the season, our grasping for the positive also takes our focus off of what we really need during difficult seasons (and every season for that matter): God himself. God is the God of all comfort. Let that sink in for a moment.

For more contact Frank Romeo God is the God of ALL comfort. And God does not simply comfort us with encouragement here or there or a thought to get us through the day. No, God is the God of all comfort because he is constantly with us. And because Jesus, God the Son, took on humanity and experienced the full human experience including suffering, God truly can identify with us and comfort us as he walks with us. It is usually a really bad idea to tell someone who is suffering "I know what you're going through," because even if you think you have experienced something similar to the person who is suffering, you have no idea what it is like to be in that person's shoes in that specific situation. Yet God does know what we're going through. And he walks with us. He stays with us. Sociologist Felicia Wu Song beautifully says it this way:

> "The good news of Christianity is that it is a religion about 'going through.' Unlike what many presume, it is not a religion that offers a formula of escape in exchange for good works or sacrifices. Instead, it promises the presence of God, the creator of the universe, who subjected himself to human suffering of the worst kind on our behalf, and he did not withdraw his hand but went through death and undid its power by overcoming it. The good news is that it is *this God who loves us and will be with us. God is not merely a benevolent grandfatherly presence who soothes us, saying 'There, there, my child.' Rather, we worship a God who not only knows what it is like to go through the very worst that life has to throw at us but chooses to be present with us and thereby empowers us to do the same.*"

It is that last sentence from Dr. Song that I find to be most encouraging; the idea that the God who has faced the worst human suffering imaginable has gone through it, and by his presence with us enables us to go through it as well. God is not the God of all comfort simply because he provides just the right uplifting thought at just the right time, he is the God of all comfort because he is with us in the midst of suffering, and he will help us go through it. And that my dear brothers and sisters, is very good news indeed.


2024 Annual Report for Service


Please excuse me if I have missed you but you can see how much service is required for our church to function. **THANK YOU** everyone for your service as everyone is needed to further our mission of love.
