The Greatest Experience

"'After me comes the one more powerful than I, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. I baptize you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." -Mark 1:7-8

What is the greatest spiritual experience you have had? I can think of a handful of powerful experiences I have had in my life, from when I officially said yes to Jesus as a young teenager, to experiencing supernatural peace when I was diagnosed with epilepsy, to the overwhelming worship experience of singing praises to God with tens of thousands of students at the Urbana Student Missions Conference as a college student.

But there is one spiritual experience that stands out in my mind, and that was the experience of One Day. One Day was just that, one day, where thousands of college students came together to some random place outside of Memphis, Tennessee. It was how Passion Conferences really got its start almost 25 years ago. But the details of that experience are still crystal clear in my mind: Being stuck in Dallas on a connecting flight because of severe thunderstorms, and students organizing prayer meetings throughout the plane while we waited for five hours on the tarmac (about 50 of us on that plane were going to One Day). Listening to Matt Redman introduce a new song but doing it with an out of tune back-up guitar because he broke a string on his first guitar and as it turns out, Matt Redman can't tune a guitar by ear. Sitting in a hot, windy, muggy field, listening to a (much younger) John Piper give a sermon that would galvanize an entire generation of students for Jesus, even while his notes blew everywhere in the wind. It really was one of the most incredible spiritual experiences I have ever had.

For those living in the Judean countryside and Jerusalem in the first century, John the Baptist was a similar spiritual experience. Mark tells us that everyone went out to experience this weirdly dressed guy who offered a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins (Mark 1:4-5). Imagine how it must have felt to confess your sins and be baptized by this awesome guy. Imagine the energy and excitement generated by John's ministry. Imagine the crowds pushing to hear this guy preach. Imagine waiting in line to be baptized. This truly was an incredible experience.

But John the Baptist refused to be the main attraction. His message to everyone was this: someone greater is coming. You think this is awesome? Wait until the main event. What I am doing for you is nothing compared to what Jesus will do for you.

What do we make of John refusing to be the main attraction? Clearly he could have been the star if he wanted to be. And what is the difference between water and the Holy Spirit? It is a little hard for us as followers of Jesus who have received the Holy Spirit to know how to apply this into our own lives. But I would suggest that even as followers of Jesus, it is all too easy to miss the main event. We settle for John the Baptist instead of seeking Jesus. It is easy to seek out spiritual experiences like traveling to One Day, or attending a powerful worship event, or listening to a well known preacher, or being part of a powerful prayer experience, over and above a daily, moment-by-moment, life-giving, life-transforming relationship with Jesus.

This fall we are starting a new sermon series working our way through the Gospel of Mark. And my deepest prayer for this series is that as we see and experience Jesus in this gospel story, we would be drawn into a deeper, more intimate relationship with him. And surely as our relationship with Jesus deepens, there will be spiritual experiences that are incredible. But my prayer is that we would see that the greatest experience we can possibly have in this world is knowing Jesus himself.

So as we go into this month, how do you need to grow closer to Jesus? Maybe you need to experience Jesus through the daily spiritual practices of bible study and prayer. Maybe you need to experience Jesus by letting him into parts of your life that you don't want him to go into. Or maybe you need to experience Jesus by being vulnerable with brothers and sisters in Christ, who can encourage you in your walk with Jesus. Whatever way you need to grow, let's make sure that we are seeking this relationship with Jesus above all else, and not settling for the John the Baptist experience. Because a daily, transformative relationship with Jesus is the greatest experience we can ever have.
