Pastor's Pen

Wisdom for Living and Serving Well

We live in a fast-paced world, constantly stimulated by social media, 24-hour news, and online access to far more information than our brains were designed to process. Kids today, because of the availability of multiple devices (phone, computer, video games, etc...) can actually consume more than 24 hours of media in a day. And because of the access to almost unlimited information, there is infinitely more for us to worry about as we have a digital front row seat to wars, famines, and crises taking place all over the world.

In addition to all of this, we continue to try and live our lives, care for our families, and put food on the table. And then of course, we want to serve God. We know that it is important to serve God in ministry, and so we serve. We help with Vacation Bible School. We help with the Children's Ministry. We help with Youth. We help on church work days. And on and on and on.

These are all good things and good ways to minister and serve God. Our church needs people to serve in these ministries and more! But the problem is that given the lives we live, we often serve with our physical, mental, and spiritual gas tanks running on empty. We have seen the warning light come on, warning us that our tank is almost empty, but we keep going. And going. And going. Until we are running on fumes. Just this week Joanna and I heard from some good friends who are burnt out at their church. They have served faithfully in ministry, but have nothing left in their tank. And sadly, I hear this story of being burnt out in ministry from many people.

How do we live and thrive and serve God in such a world? How do we make sure that our tanks are full so that we can live and serve and thrive? Well, sometimes the best wisdom for life today comes from the most unlikely of sources. Bernard of Clairvaux was a 12th century Benedictine monk, but his writing sounds like it was written for our busy, running on fumes lives today:

"The man who is wise, therefore, will see his life as more like a reservoir than a canal. The canal simultaneously pours out what it receives; the reservoir retains the water till it is filled, then discharges the overflow without loss to itself . . . Today there are many in the Church who act like canals, the reservoirs are far too rare . . . You too must learn to await this fullness before pouring out your gifts, do not try to be more generous than God" (Bernard of Clairvaux).

Bernard rightly observes that many people are like canals...they simply channel whatever little they have and pour that into life and ministry, and then of course have nothing left to give after that. Clearly this does not lead to long-term health in terms of life or ministry. Thankfully Bernard offers a different approach: be a reservoir. Be a reservoir where God fills you up all the way to capacity. And then, as your reservoir overflows, you bless others in ministry, but you are not running on fumes yourself. You still have plenty in your full reservoir to live and thrive and continue to love and bless those around you.

This, in a nutshell, is what Christian discipleship should look like; to be so filled up with the love of God that it overflows onto the people around us as we serve in ministry. And then, as we continue to be filled with God's love in our walk with him, we are continually able to let that love overflow in ongoing ministry.

Many of you know that I am on the last lap of an academic program at Talbot School of Theology, working on a Doctor of Ministry degree. I can see the finish line! And my research has focused on this very topic: What does it look like to have a discipleship process that looks like what Bernard of Clairvaux describes? What does it look like to be so filled with the love of God that it overflows into a fruitful, Spirit-filled ministry? Many discipleship programs and tools that are out there today focus on a personal relationship with Jesus, or teach ministry skills, but don't see one as flowing from the other. So my research has been to create a process that helps someone's growing relationship with God to flow into fruitful (and sustainable!) service for God.

As we head into this fall, if you are feeling burnt out, like your tank is on empty, or that you are trying to serve like a canal and not a reservoir, this discipleship process is for you. If you have served our church faithfully in the past but are looking to grow closer to the Lord and serve him faithfully in a new season (maybe in an entirely different way!), this process is for you. And if you want to serve the Lord but are not sure of how or where to start, this process is for you.

If this describes you in any way, shape, or form, please come talk to me in the weeks ahead. I would love to help you get your spiritual reservoir filled and discover the joy of serving from an overflow of that reservoir, rather than serving on fumes. And as more of our church serves from an overflow of God's love pouring out of us, it will have a beautiful impact on our church family and surrounding community.
