Peace That Surpasses All Understanding

"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid (John 14:27)."

As we enter this Advent Season, we currently live in a world that is longing for peace. We are longing for peace to come in the midst of wars around the globe where innocent people are killed every day. Here at home, we are longing for peace in our country, where there is so much political and cultural division. And in our own personal lives, we are longing for peace. With the instability from the recent government shutdown and other events in our country, my retirement account has been bouncing up and down like a kid on a trampoline...not exactly the most peaceful thing to watch when it involves your own money!

But beyond financial uncertainty, there are any number of other factors that contribute to our lack of peace this Advent Season. Mental health struggles. Life transitions. Job instability. Grief and loss. Personal conflict. I could go on and on, and I am sure you can add to this list from things in your own life that are causing you to experience a lack of peace.

So here is the problem: We are entering a season where we sing about Jesus being the Prince of Peace, and yet in our own lives we are not experiencing peace. There is a seeming disconnect between what we sing about and celebrate each Christmas, and what we are actually feeling and experiencing. So does the Bible actually offer us something to bring us peace this Christmas?

Thankfully, the answer is a resounding yes! Jesus tells his followers that he is giving his peace to them. Think about that. Jesus' perfect peace as God the Son, is given to us as followers of Jesus. In Ephesians 2:14 Paul says that Jesus is our peace, and can bring peace in a way that no one or nothing else can.

What this suggests is that Jesus' peace that he gives to us is a kind of peace that is infinitely greater than the kind of peace we try to cultivate in our own lives when we are lacking peace. The kind of peace we try to cultivate is like a band aid; it helps for a while but doesn't really solve the problem. But Jesus' peace is something much greater and longer lasting.

When I was in Scouts as a teenager, I was part of a COPE course one summer at summer camp. COPE is for older Scouts, and goes beyond learning basic outdoors skills and dives into deeper leadership and life skills. And one exercise from that course comes to mind as I think about the difference between Jesus' peace and the kind of peace we try to cultivate in our own lives. For this exercise, we were given a large barrel by the side of a lake. Our challenge was to make the barrel overflow with water. But there was one problem. The barrel was full of holes. No matter how fast we filled the barrel with water, we could never get close enough to make the barrel overflow with water... until...one of our group members had the brilliant idea of putting the barrel IN the lake, and putting the largest kid in our course IN the barrel. Then, and only then, were we able to make the barrel overflow with a few quick scoops of water.

But even with this plan, the water only overflowed momentarily. We accomplished our goal, we did what we were challenged to do. But at the end of the day, the barrel still had holes. Once the Scout was taken out of the barrel (shivering by this point!) and the barrel was taken out of the lake, the barrel was as empty as ever. And this is similar to what happens when we try to cultivate peace on our own apart from Jesus. We can bring about a sense of peace in our lives, but only for a short time.

How is Jesus' peace better? The word for peace in the Bible means whole or complete. A wall that does not have any holes or damages in it can be said to be in a state of peace. What this means for us is that Jesus is not giving us a better strategy to fill our barrel that is full of holes. He is giving us a new barrel with no holes. He is giving us peace that does not leak.

My hope and prayer for us as a church family this Advent Season is that we can experience this kind of peace. Jesus' peace. A peace that makes us whole and complete, even if the circumstances in our lives are trying to destroy our peace. This is what we will be exploring during our Advent worship services each Sunday as we prepare our hearts for Christmas.

So I would like to invite you to do two things this month. One, come each Sunday as we look at this amazing peace that Jesus offers to us. Talk with friends at church each Sunday about how you need Jesus' peace and how you can experience this peace. And two, if you are struggling to experience peace in a certain area of your life, come talk to me or to one of the Elders (Carl Jensen and Tony DaVee). We would love to pray for you and help you experience Jesus' supernatural, everlasting peace.

Now I will be the first to tell you that I don't always experience Jesus' peace. I easily get caught up in the stressors of this world, and there are times that I am lacking in experiencing this peace. But I do know this: I know that a barrel without holes is better than a barrel with holes. And when I have experienced Jesus' perfect peace, it is a far greater peace than anything I can find in this world. So this Christmas, let's take Jesus up on his offer, and experience his perfect, whole, complete, peace.

Serra Mesa Food Pantry

"Greetings!

The food pantry volunteer team is working hard to serve Serra Mesa families in need.

Before the pandemic lockdown, we distributed food to 75-90 families every Wednesday. During the lockdown, 150-160 families needed help. Last week, because of the SNAP/EBT delays, we had an overwhelming 210 families.

Our community is responding with food and financial donations. Several groups are having food drives to help.

We have recently established a partnership with a nation-wide organization called Community Loaves. They match home bakers with nearby food pantries. The home bakers bring bread loaves and energy cookies every two weeks. You may have noticed the posters in the pantry window. This has been a helpful partnership since our bread donations from Panera and Bread & Cie Bakery are much smaller now.

We are so grateful for your support and permission to use the storage rooms to accommodate the extra food supplies. Thank you for enabling this mission to continue.
