

Pastor's Pen

"For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast. For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do" (Eph. 2:8-10).

I am thankful for many things as we enter November and set our sights on Thanksgiving at the end of the month. I am thankful for my family. I'm thankful for our church family. I'm thankful for God's provision in our lives. And I'm thankful that I'm nearing the end of my doctoral program (I can see the finish line just a few months away!).

But in recent weeks, I have become increasingly thankful for God's grace in my life. The more I reflect on God's grace, the more I am thankful for it. Grace is one of those things that many Christians believe in but don't have a full appreciation of what it actually does in our lives. And so as we approach Thanksgiving this month, I want to share a few thoughts on this beautiful thing called grace, and invite us all to take time to thank God for his amazing grace in our lives.

Grace is foundational to the Christian faith. Paul writes that we are saved by grace alone through faith: "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast" (Eph. 2:8-9). We cannot earn our salvation; we must accept the free gift of God. This message of salvation is commonly understood in evangelical Christian circles.

What is less commonly understood however, is how God's grace continues to work in the lives of believers beyond the point of their initial salvation. Paul makes it clear that God's grace not only saves us, but shapes us for our ministry and service to God: "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do" (Eph. 2:10). And yet God's grace is typically not thought of as foundational to the rest of the Christian life. Author and pastor Timothy Keller highlights this misunderstanding of God's grace when he speaks of the gospel message:

"The gospel is not just the ABCs but the A to Z of the Christian life. It is inaccurate to think the gospel is what saves non-Christians, and then Christians mature by trying hard to live according to biblical principles. It is more accurate to say that we are saved by believing the gospel, and then we are transformed in every part of our minds, hearts, and lives by believing the gospel more deeply as life goes on" (Timothy Keller, *Center Church: Doing Balanced, Gospel-Centered Ministry in Your City, 48*).

When the gospel message of God's grace is not emphasized beyond the message of salvation, Keller rightly points out that Christians end up trying to live the Christian life and serve in Christian ministry out of their own strength. This self-effort in spiritual growth and ministry service always ends up in frustration and failure, because we are trying to do something that only God's grace can do in us. If the gospel is only understood as a ticket to heaven as it commonly is, then the burden of both spiritual growth and ministry service fall to the self-effort of believers, which is the death-knell of one's spiritual growth and ministry. I can tell you from personal experience that I have tried to serve God in my own strength, and have tried to grow closer to Jesus through self-effort. It doesn't work.

However, when we accept God's grace in our lives as we do when we are first saved, then spiritual growth and ministry flow from that grace. How? Think about what happened to the prophet Isaiah when he was commissioned as a prophet by God in Isaiah 6:1-13. Isaiah has a vision where he is caught up into the throne room of God. He is devastated because he knows that being that close to the presence of God should kill him, just like one dies if they get too close to the sun. And yet a seraphim (angel like creature) takes a burning coal, touches his lips, and says "your guilt is taken away and your sin atoned for" (Is. 6:7). This is an act of grace. Isaiah is not destroyed by God's holy grace, he is transformed by it. And then, being transformed by God's grace, Isaiah is then ready to receive his commission as a prophet (Is. 6:8-13).

What does that mean for us? Well, it means that the way that we grow closer to Jesus and serve Jesus in ministry is not through self-effort and trying harder, but by coming into God's presence, staying in God's presence, and being transformed by God's grace. It means that every day, our ability to love Jesus and serve Jesus begins and ends with us staying close to Jesus. God's grace will equip and enable us to do what we need to do. We just need to stay close to the one who transforms us by his grace.

There are any number of things we can do to get close to Jesus and stay close to Jesus to experience his transforming grace; practices that theologians call "means of grace." But there are two means of grace that I think are particularly important. First, we can have a regular time of reading God's Word. Jesus prays to the Father that his disciples would be sanctified by the truth, noting that God's Word is truth (John 17:17). The more time we spend in God's Word, the more we are shaped and formed by God's transforming grace.

And second, we can pray. The more we come close to the Lord through prayer, the more God's grace transforms us. I find that my best times of prayer are when I am out taking a walk, but I have also learned over the years that it is good to pray at all times and in all circumstances (1 Thess. 5:17-18). Even as you talk with someone you can be simultaneously praying quietly "Lord, how can I help this person, how can I love this person?"

There are many more means of grace by which we can draw closer to God so that we are transformed by his grace. But if you are not in a regular practice of taking in God's Word and praying, try adding these practices into your daily routine. Come close to God. Experience his grace. And then watch as that grace transforms you.

The more we grow in grace, the more thankful we will be for that grace. God's grace does not just save us, God's grace also transforms us from the inside out. And as we look towards Thanksgiving this month, I am so incredibly thankful that God not only saved me, but still continues to graciously work in my life, drawing me closer to himself, and transforming my heart so that I can serve him well. I hope you will join me this month (and every month!) in giving thanks for God's amazing grace!
